



Traffic Light Protocol (TLP): Document Designation and Information Sharing Policy

The E-ISAC employs the Traffic Light Protocol developed by DHS US-CERT for designating the information/documents posted to the E-ISAC Portal, and as a way to instruct entities as to whether and with whom they may share such information/documents. The US-CERT describes the TLP as follows:

The Traffic Light Protocol (TLP) was created in order to facilitate greater sharing of information. TLP is a set of designations used to ensure that sensitive information is shared with the appropriate audience. It employs four colors to indicate expected sharing boundaries to be applied by the recipient(s).

The originator of information should label the information with the correct TLP color in order to indicate how widely that information may be disseminated, usually by including "TLP: [COLOR]" in unambiguous text in the header and footer of the document and initialing the markings. If a recipient needs to share the information more widely than indicated by the original TLP designation, they must refer back to the original source.

Cross-sector and other partners that are provided information from the E-ISAC may share such information across their direct community/organization with clear expectations that the end use members also adhere to TLP and any other asserted protection and handling expectations. The E-ISAC will also handle cross-sector and other partner received information in a similar manner when sharing with its members. COLOR	When should it be used?	How may it be shared?	E-ISAC Additional Guidance
RED	Sources may use TLP:RED when information cannot be effectively acted upon by additional parties and could lead to impacts on a party's privacy, reputation, or operations if misused.	Recipients may not share TLP:RED information with any parties outside of the specific exchange, meeting, or conversation in which it is originally disclosed.	For E-ISAC eyes only and parties directly involved.
AMBER	Sources may use TLP:AMBER when information requires support to be effectively acted upon yet carries risks to privacy, reputation, or operations if shared outside of the organizations involved.	Recipients may only share TLP:AMBER information with members of their own organization, and with clients or customers who need to know the information to protect themselves or prevent further harm. Sources are at liberty to specify additional intended limits of the sharing: these must be adhered to.	For members: internal use only (do not distribute outside your company). For partners: may be distributed outside your organization only with E-ISAC permission
GREEN	Sources may use TLP:GREEN when information is useful for the awareness of all participating organizations, as well as with peers within the broader community or sector.	Recipients may share TLP:GREEN information with peers and partner organizations within their sector or community, but not via publicly accessible channels.	For internal use and necessary consultants/third-party providers.
WHITE	Sources may use TLP:WHITE when information carries minimal or no foreseeable risk of misuse, in accordance with applicable Rules and Procedures for public release.	TLP:WHITE information may be distributed without restriction, subject to copyright controls.	No restrictions for unmarked, public information.
